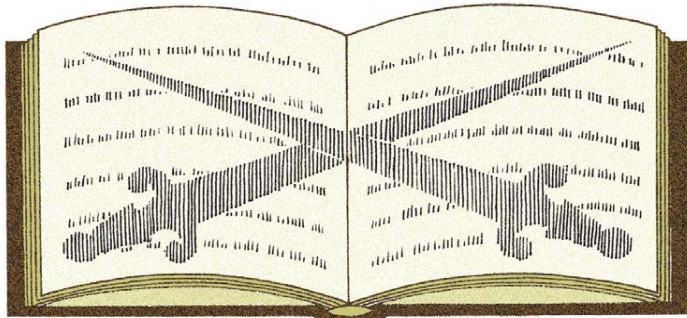

Note from Pastor:

The Vatican II Document "Lumen Gentium", in paragraph 8, describes the way the Catholic Church understands herself to be the one Church established by Christ himself:

The one Church of Christ... which He erected for all ages as "the pillar and mainstay of the truth"... subsists in the Catholic Church, which is governed by the successor of Peter and by the Bishops in communion with him although many elements of sanctification and of truth are found outside of its visible structure. These elements, as gifts belonging to the Church of Christ, are forces impelling toward catholic unity.

In saying that the Church instituted by Christ, as described in Matthew 16:18, "subsists" in the Catholic Church, the document makes the clear assertion that it is in the Catholic Church that the fullness of the Church instituted by Christ can be found.

The second part of the statement makes clear that other churches and Christian communities have a partial share—a real but imperfect unity—with that Church. That partial unity is the basis on which we are called to continue to work towards full unity amongst all the baptized in the one Church established by Christ. It's good for us to help that partial unity grow by praying together with our baptized brothers and sisters who are not Catholic. We work with them to build a just and moral society. We find common cause in helping the poor and vulnerable in the name of Christ.

The document charts a way for us to understand how we do have partial unity with non-Catholic Christians, and how we need to work to make that partial unity stronger and fuller, in the one Church founded by Christ.

One question that has come up recently is concerning attending Sunday worship in a Protestant Church with friends or family. We are certainly allowed to do so and it can be a good way to build and strengthen our imperfect unity. We should, however, refrain from anything that dilute our Catholic identity or signify our membership or full communion with a non-Catholic group, such as receiving communion or baptism or taking a leadership role in a ministry.

On the other hand, it's important to recognize that attending a non-Catholic Sunday service does not fulfill our Sunday obligation to attend Mass. That obligation binds us together in faith and is our acknowledgement of the Eucharist as the source and summit of our faith.

For true and authentic unity to grow we have to be clear that we build on what we have in common and we recognize that we still have a way to go on healing the things that separate us. We turn together in faith to God for his grace and strength in making that happen.
